Short Bio-note

Jely A. Galang is Assistant Professor of History at the University of the Philippines (UP) in Diliman, Quezon City. He is currently on study leave to pursue postgraduate studies (PhD Asian Studies – History) at Murdoch University, in Perth, Western Australia. His dissertation examines the lives and circumstances of working class Chinese in the nineteenth-century Philippines, with particular emphasis on vagrants, unemployed and marginally-employed, as well as those unable to pay their taxes and had no documents of identification. His work analyzes how these social outcasts – considered by the Spanish colonial state as “dangerous” and potential criminals – employed overt and subtle strategies in order to live and survive.

Asst. Prof. Galang has handled classes in Philippine History, Asian History, and Philippine Institutions 100. Before he became part of the UP Diliman History Department, he taught at UP Los Baños. He received his BA (*cum laude*, 2004), and MA (2009) History degrees from UP Diliman. In 2010, he was the recipient of the Young Historian’s Prize for his master’s thesis on Ilocano migration to Tarlac (1860-1935). The Prize was awarded by the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA).

Asst. Prof. Galang has presented papers in local and international conferences mostly related to Philippine Chinese and Chinese diaspora. He has published in academic journals such as Saliksik: ADHIKA ng Pilipinas Journal, and the Philippine Social Sciences Review. He also contributes to Tulay: The Chinese Filipino Digest. He is a member of the Philippine National Historical Society (PNHS), Philippine Association for Chinese Studies (PACS), and Asian Studies Association of Australia (ASAA).
